This award is presented to one individualor group of employees in the Division who has demonstrated an exemplary level of integrity and professionalism within the Division and University. The Pillar award is considered the Division's Employee of the Year Award.

Criteria for nomination:

- o Recipientsof the Pillarof Excellence Award must demonstrate one or more of the following:
 - f Dedicationandcommitmentto achieving the mission/purpose of the University, the Division and their respective program(s)/service
 - f Personal style and influence which motivates and inspire shose with whom they interact
 - f Performance of assignedasks in an exemplary fashion while inspiring others to improve
 - f Outstanding conducandteamworkin the performance of their duties
 - f Exceptional eliability, cooperation and collegiality toward achieving departmental,
 Division and University goals and objectives

Spirit of Excellence Award

This award is presented to up to two individual and/or group of colleagues outside ivision for their integrity, unwavering ommitment to student success pirit of collaboration in an environment characterized by adversity, and their continuous collaborative efforts in the pursuit of excellence.

Criteria for nomination:

- o Recipientsof the Spiritof Excellence Award must demonstrate one or more of the following:
 - f Assisted the Division of Student Affairs in acquiring resources for programs and services or implemented newprocessor policythat supports studen success
 - f Demonstratedexemplarycustomerservice and/or supportfor studentsandthe Division of Student Affairs
 - f Collaboratedin identifyingcreativesolutionsthat madea significant anplositive difference for students and/or the Division of Student Affairs
 - f Supported the holistic education for which CI stands

Excellence in Programming for DEIA & Belonging

Criteria for nomination:

Programs receiving the EIA & Belongine ward must exemplify one or more of the following:

- o Addressed issues of DEIA and Belonging
- o Met

NOMINATION & SELECTION PROCESS:

Nominations will be accepted each year through April 15.

- f Incomplete nomination will not be accepted.
- f Eachawardnominationshouldmeet the minimum word count per section
- f Nominationswill only beaccepted rom employees within the DSA.
- f Nominationsmust be received by the deadline.
- f Multiple nominations donot guaranteæn awardeeof a particular category.

Award Recipient Selection Process:

All award nominations will be reviewed anated by a Division committeeomprised of the Division's LeadTeam(4 AVPs)aswell asone non-MPPstaffmemberfrom eachsubarea(4) in the Division. Each AVPwill designate an alternate committee member to serve in the case of a conflict of interest with a committee member who is also nominated for a specific category.
